It had finally started, and overnight two new chicks joined our school. It was so nice to see the children hear of the news, as some were so excited, they even ran into school that day.



Our chicks received a big welcome - Sycamore and Redwood. The children were so excited (it was hard to get them to do any work that day) as they waited in anticipation, to see who would be joining us next.

Within a day, two other chicks hatched - Willow and Oak. The children were so desperate to cuddle the chicks, but knew they should wait (never over-handling them) as we didn't want to stress them. After a while, leaving them to settle in, our first task of that day was to say hello with a gentle cuddle.

The chicks have grown so quickly, their feathers have changed and they began to eat chick food. They especially enjoyed a treat of grass (in small doses) and were used to being cuddled by the children and staff!



Over one weekend, as the weather was warm and for a short time only, the chicks explored outside. They were so keen to see what the 'green carpet' was at their feet!



Day by day, the chicks have grown quite quickly. They are eating well and had their first mini molt, around 6-8 days old. This should be completed by 4 weeks, when the chick's down is replaced by its first feathers.

Year 5 have opened their doors, so everyone in school had a chance to see the chicks, before the time comes for them to be returned to the farm.
