



Welcome Back

We hope that you have had a restful holiday and that your family has continued to remain safe and well through these very strange times. Hopefully you had a wonderful summer break and enjoyed the beautiful sunshine we had! We both are so glad to be back to a routine and doing what we both love; we are sure the children feel the same way too! This term is always an exciting term with plenty of new topics and themes to explore. Our focus will be on nurture, and helping our children through these difficult times.

We are looking forward to meeting new parents and saying hello to parents of children we have both taught in previous years. Please feel free to introduce yourselves to us and say hello on the gate in the mornings.

Mrs Dallas will be teaching Monday to Friday. Mrs Burgess will be supporting in class, Monday to Friday. A coach will be teaching P.E. on Tuesday afternoon. Mrs May will be teaching children in our Forest School on Friday afternoons.

English

This term in English, the children will:

- Focus on exploration of text, reading 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes;
- Learn how to discuss the structure and language features of the text;
- Develop planning skills and writing using effective vocabulary, grammar and punctuation.

Maths

This term in Maths, the children will:

- Focus on Place Value to 1,000 -comparing and ordering numbers;
- Adding and subtracting 3-digit numbers;
- Multiplying and dividing by 3, 4 and 8;
- Problem solving.

Science

This term, the topic we will be covering is Animals, including Humans – Keeping Healthy. We will be looking at various groups of food needed for a balanced diet. We will investigate which foods different animals eat and we will explore the human and the animal skeleton, as well as the muscles and other body parts and their special functions.

Geography

Our geography topic is "The UK". We will learn how to locate U.K in the world and we will revisit names of countries in U.K. We will explore counties in U.K and identify key topographical features and land use patterns, as well as learning about the difference between towns and cities and towns and villages.

History

After half term, we will begin our History topic "Local History" – we will explore our local area, look at trends over time, learn how to gather information from a range of sources, learn about the growth of the area and the changes in the land use and industry.

PE

This term your child will be having PE on Monday afternoon and on Tuesday afternoon (this session is taught by a coach). Your child will change into their PE kit at school so make sure all items are named and in a named drawstring bag. You will need to refer to the uniform policy on the website for the full kit list. Please note that leggings are not part of the PE uniform. As far as possible PE will be outside, so please ensure they have warmer PE kit as the weather gets colder through the term.

RE

The children will be starting with the topic of Communion, and its importance for Christians.

French (for KS2)

This term we will be learning greetings, colours, sizes and shapes, as well as using shapes in the style of Matisse.

Computing

We will look at online safety to begin with, and then desktop publishing, creating great templates. After half term we will learn how to animate.

Forest School

Our Forest School day is Friday. Please refer to the school website and click on the 'Forest School' tab for more information.

Trips

We are hoping to take an educational visit to Milton Keynes after half term. More information will follow.

Homework

In order to support and consolidate your child's learning this term we expect all of the following homework to be done daily:

Reading – Please hear your child read their school reading book for 10 – 15 minutes using one or two questions from the reading bookmark every time to develop your child's comprehension. These books need to come back into school each day. Please record each time you have read with your child in their reading record. Your child will also bring home a library book for you to share together. These need to be in school on a Wednesday as this is when we will change them. We have spent a lot of money over the last few years on books so please take care of them and encourage your child to do the same. If you find you have any school reading books at home then please send them in with your child.

Spellings – On a Monday your child's spelling list will be uploaded onto Class Dojo. Please practise these spellings each day ready for their spelling test on the following Monday. At the meet the teacher meeting I will go through the best way to help your child to learn these words.

Maths – In order for your child to have a sound knowledge of basic maths concepts that they can apply to lots of maths areas, each Monday I will upload a number focus onto Class Dojo. This could be practising counting, recall of number bonds or rehearsing multiplication tables. The children will then share what they have learnt in a challenge the following Monday.

Remember to check the 'Latest News' on the school website to keep up to date with what is happening. The school newsletter will come out on the last Friday of the month and will celebrate what we have been up to and will tell you what is coming up in the next month. Behaviour & Rewards

Dojo points – These are given to children demonstrating the school values, e.g. sharing a good piece of work or demonstrating good manners. The children will receive certificates to mark 50-point milestones in the celebration assembly.

Sharing outside achievements – children will be able to share achievements from outside school in celebration assembly, e.g. swimming badges.

Weekly certificate – one child in each class will receive a values certificate in celebration assembly for showing the school values.

Governor award – Termly the class will hold a secret vote for one person in their class who they feel has consistently demonstrated the school values. These children will be presented with a Governor badge to be worn on their uniform.

Headteacher postcard – these are awarded to children when they are sent to the headteacher for demonstrating good behaviour, completing good work and for clear evidence of showing the school values.

Equipment

Please send your child in each day with a clear named drinks bottle filled with water which can be refilled throughout the day. Your child does not need any specific stationary, equipment or a pencil case for their lessons as we will provide pencils etc. If they would prefer to bring in their own equipment then please ensure everything is named and the pencil case is a sensible size. Please make sure your child has a waterproof coat for school which is clearly named.
