Covid -19 Reporting information

If your child has a **positive case** before the 7th April, please email the school immediately by using the <u>admin@overstone-wing.org</u> email as we will have to inform anyone who had close contact with your child within 48 hours of the positive test and isolate your child's bubble.

If anyone in your household has symptoms please request a polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test. The lateral flow test devices (LFDs) are only to be used to detect asymptomatic people and not those who have covid-19 symptoms or feel unwell.

We will be monitoring the email but we will not be in school to take telephone calls.

If we are informed of a positive case you will receive an email from us if your child needs to isolate over the holiday. This will only happen if someone tests positive within 48 hours of being in school.

If you are contacted by NHS test and trace and asked to isolate during the holiday please let us know when you child's return date will be.
