As part of our Olympic week the whole school had an assembly with Ryan Raghoo, a paralympic sprinter and long jump record holder. His story was truly inspirational having faced huge barriers in being able to participate in sport due to his cerebral palsy. His secondary school banned him from physical education for 5 years due to his condition. He was determined to achieve sporting greatness and began his journey at 18 years old and very soon after made the GB team. The children had an opportunity to meet Ryan in a class session and ask him questions about his achievements.



On Wednesday Years 1 - 6 visited Wing Tennis Club and participated in a taster tennis session. The children were amazing, in spite of the heat, and showed real enthusiasm for the game. Wing Tennis club are looking for younger members and are running coaching sessions on Wednesday evenings.



# Oak Class

Year 4 have really enjoyed their science this half tern where they have conducted experiments which answered the question 'Does the viscosity of a liquid affect how fast it flows?' The children worked well in groups and were able to conduct a fair and accurate test before reporting on their results and findings.
