A new year and we are at the end of January already!

This half term we have started to work through multiplication and division in Mathematics. A key focus for us in Key Stage One has been to focus on the children's understanding of the related vocabulary within lessons, to support their understanding and ability to talk about what they have achieved through their work. In our literacy sessions, the texts chosen are classic stories, which involve animals, to relate to our term topic. We have already planned and written stories based upon 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. Our next text will be a version of 'The Jungle Book'.

This half term our topic is: -**Myself and Animals**

We have started a new topic this month. In this topic the children have begun to look at animal patterns in Art, Animals in Christian stories in RE and habitats in Science and Geography. They are also covering gymnastics, with an underwater theme, and looking at throwing, ready for a house dodge ball competition.



Over this term we will be introducing some new ways to support the pupils skills in reading. Guided reading will become a planned activity in literacy sessions and Accelerated Reading will be introduced, both supporting the pupils comprehension skills. The children will also have the chance to visit the library again regularly and the school will host a book fair, when children and parents can view and purchase books. **Reading is a skill that needs practice, so please make sure your child is heard reading regularly and always brings their reading book to school.**
