News from our classes

<u>Acorn</u> We are so pleased to see all the children have settled in well and are happy. They have been learning about themselves, looking at similarities and differences and talking about families and pets. We have been discussing our feelings and emotions and what makes us happy and sad. We have named our big teddy Big Buddy! He loves cuddles and stories.

<u>Ash</u> September has been a busy and exciting month for us in Ash Class as children have taken their first steps into school. We have been exploring our indoor and outdoor environment, learning new routines and making friends. One day, we even found an enormous hole in our playground! We wondered if it had been made by someone stomping on the ground or if an animal had dug it to make a home. Perhaps a mole or a badger lives in there? We will keep you updated...

<u>Beech</u> We have been settling into our new classroom. We have enjoyed learning about old toys and using the book Major Glad, Major Dizzy in Literacy. In Maths we have started to look at one more and one less. We have also identified technology in the classroom and talked about computer safety.

<u>Elm</u> We have been learning about being a good friend in PHSE lessons. Our top tips for being a good friend are: have fun, play together, smile and dance together and say friendly things.

<u>Fir</u> We have been very busy studying our book 'The Iron Man' in English using dictionaries to find synonyms to help evaluate our writing. We are preparing for our own creative narrative writing by using interesting language like personification and kennings (two-word phrases that replace a one word noun e.g. a small-squeaker = mouse). We have shown great enthusiasm in learning French and enjoyed making conversation with our talking partners.

<u>Holly</u> have enjoyed the PSHE lesson on self-worth and finding out what others felt about them. This was a super positive experience for them realising what their peers thought about them. We too in Holly Class have written some super work in English, "The silvery, gold moon sparkled over the gleaming blue ocean. Each and every plank of wood collapsed on the sandy desert island." We are looking forward to making Mediterranean inspired dishes in DT later on this half term.

<u>Oak</u> We are really pleased with the progress they have been making in English and improving their sentence structure and looking at using much more adventurous vocabulary. An example of such super writing is "This morning, the children happily fixed their old boat and now it is very secure." Forest School has been a super regular addition to our timetable and they have enjoyed their experience down there so far and are doing activities related to our topic The Anglo Saxons.

<u>Redwood</u> We have had a full first few weeks back; In English we have been learning all about Apollo 11 and the first man on the Moon. In Maths we've looked at rounding all the way up to the nearest 10,000! We've loved singing 'Living on a prayer' in Music and looking at a real Quran in RE. We've learnt some new games as well as remembered Tag Rugby in PE. We can hold a conversation in French about our families and in Computing we are learning how systems and networks work. In History we're exploring how people were punished for committing crimes in different time periods.

<u>Sycamore</u> In class the children have all settled well and are all working together as a class. Last Wednesday we visited the local church allowing the children to enquire about Christian Saints and we even investigated the crypt! At the school children's fete Year 6 were working on stalls and helping the nursery and reception children around the fete.

<u>Willow</u> We have been enjoying learning about habitats. In Science we've carried out investigations using sweets, using a classification key to sort the different types. We've been learning how to write a diary in English and understanding what emotive language is using drama. In Geography we have been using Google maps and Ordinance Survey maps to find out about where we live.
