What we have been up to in September.....

Beech Class



In Year 1, we have had such a busy and fun time, learning about weather and observing seasonal change in Science. The children enjoyed moving around the school site looking at nature that will change over the seasons.

We have enjoyed immersing in our new book, Old Bear, in English, as well as sharing precious memories in History. It has been lovely seeing the children working together as they experience new areas of learning.





Acorn Class

It was lovely to see everyone back at Pre-School and we welcome all our new children and families.

This term our topic is "All about me". We will be looking at ourselves, our features and bodies, looking at similarities/differences between us. We will discuss our families, who our family members are etc. We will look at our 5 senses and how we use which body part for each sense.

We will also look at the seasonal changes that are happening around us, discussing the leaf colour changes and collect some conkers

The children have enjoyed getting to know one another and the Pre-School routine, lots of stories and fun in the sand pit.



Yew Class

In Art we have been experimenting using a selection of different materials to create expressive marks. We first looked at some early human markings and how art was used to communicate. The children then designed and chose their own tools from a wide range of materials and went on to create a piece of work using all the different tools they had gathered.





Fir Class

Year 3 have been working hard in DT this term. They have investigated how to join 2D card shapes to make a 3D structure. The children then explored folding and rolling the cardboard to give it structure and used the slot technique to join shapes together without glue or tape. The aim of the task was to create a 3D model that supports itself and it was great to see the children succeeding with this.





Oak Class



Year 4 have had a great start to the term. We have been studying 'Computer systems and networks' in our Computing lessons and the children have been familiarizing themselves with Google accounts. They have been shown different aspects of their Google drive including 'Docs' and 'Slides' and they spent some time exploring. It's a lot to learn but they have made an amazing start.

Redwood Class

In Year 5, we've wasted no time in growing our creative writing skills! After learning about poetic techniques, and how to use them, we all created our own poems. We drafted them, edited them, typed them up, and then had so much fun designing a picture to go with them.

Year 2 have had a fantastic start to the year! They have worked so hard in English, enjoying our class story "The River". The children have been writing great alliteration poems and have enjoyed coming up with ideas for their own stories through role play and lots of class discussion. Music has been wonderful – Deciding on different rhythms and dynamics to portray different animals and learning to follow a leader during call and response sessions. They have also been great Scientists and Historians, discovering facts about schools in the past, and learning all about the six different life processes. What a great start to the term!
